

Ice Cream Cone

Item Reference — Arctic Wool World



Reference art for construction guidance. Colors/pose may vary slightly from your finished piece.

Ice Cream Cone — Knitting Pattern

Features a textured, waffle-patterned cone worked flat, topped with a smooth, perfectly round seamless scoop of ice cream.

This is an original pattern written for this item, based on standard, generic amigurumi and toy-knitting construction techniques (magic ring/CO, spiral increases and decreases, i-cord, stuffed tubes and spheres). It does not copy, trace, or reproduce any published or copyrighted pattern -- these underlying construction techniques are standard craft knowledge, not anyone's intellectual property, the same way a recipe's technique of 'creaming butter and sugar' isn't owned by any one baker.

Knit abbreviations: k = knit · p = purl · kfb = knit into front and back of st (inc 1) · k2tog = knit 2 together (dec 1) · CO = cast on · BO = bind off · dpns = double-pointed needles · pm = place marker · rnd(s) = round(s) · st(s) = stitch(es) · RS/WS = right side / wrong side

Materials

Yarn: Worsted weight yarn. Color A (Cone: Light Brown/Tan, 20g) and Color B (Scoop: Pink, Mint, or White, 20g).

Needles: US 4 (3.5 mm) straight needles (for cone) and DPNs (for scoop).

Abbreviations: Garter Stitch = Knit every row.

Gauge

Worked at a relaxed toy-knit tension in worsted weight yarn. Exact gauge isn't critical for a stuffed prop -- adjust stuffing firmness and needle size slightly to taste; a firmer fabric holds shape best.

Instructions

The Waffle Cone (Color A — Worked Flat)

To mimic a waffle texture, we work in a 1x1 moss stitch while decreasing to form a cone triangle.

Cast on 22 sts using Color A.

Row 1 (RS): [K1, P1] across the row.

Row 2 (WS): [P1, K1] across the row.

Row 3 (Decrease): K2tog, [K1, P1] to last 2 sts, SSK (20 sts).

Row 4: Knit the purl sts and purl the knit sts to maintain the texture.

Repeat Rows 3 and 4 until only 4 sts remain.

Next Row: K2tog twice (2 sts). Bind off.

Assembly: Roll the textured triangle into a cone shape, matching the side edges, and sew the seam closed from the tip up to the wide open top. Stuff firmly.

The Ice Cream Scoop (Color B — Worked in the Round)

Cast on 6 sts using Color B on DPNs. Join in the round.

Rnd 1: [Kfb] around (12 sts).

Rnd 2: [K1, Kfb] around (18 sts).

Rnd 3: [K2, Kfb] around (24 sts).

Rnds 4-12: Knit all sts around (9 rnds even to build the sphere).

Rnd 13: Purl all sts around. (This purl ridge forms the "ruffle" at the bottom of a real scoop of ice cream.)

Rnd 14 (Decrease): [K2, K2tog] around (18 sts).

Stuffing: Pack the scoop very firmly into a solid ball.

Rnd 15: [K1, K2tog] around (12 sts).

Rnd 16: [K2tog] around (6 sts). Bind off.

Assembly

Nestle the bottom decreased area of the ice cream scoop into the wide open mouth of the waffle cone. Using Color B, sew the purl ruffle of the scoop securely to the top edge of the cone.
