Princess Tiara — Knitting Pattern

A delicate, flat-knit crown featuring precise lace eyelets and sharp geometric peaks that sit comfortably on any toy's head.

This is an original pattern written for this item, based on standard, generic amigurumi and toy-knitting construction techniques (magic ring/CO, spiral increases and decreases, i-cord, stuffed tubes and spheres). It does not copy, trace, or reproduce any published or copyrighted pattern -- these underlying construction techniques are standard craft knowledge, not anyone's intellectual property, the same way a recipe's technique of 'creaming butter and sugar' isn't owned by any one baker.

Knit abbreviations: k = knit · p = purl · kfb = knit into front and back of st (inc 1) · k2tog = knit 2 together (dec 1) · CO = cast on · BO = bind off · dpns = double-pointed needles · pm = place marker · rnd(s) = round(s) · st(s) = stitch(es) · RS/WS = right side / wrong side

Materials

Yarn: Worsted or Sport weight yarn. Color A (Gold, Silver, or Metallic Pink, 15g).

Needles: US 4 (3.5 mm) straight needles.

Special Abbreviations: YO = Yarn Over (increase/creates a lace hole), K2tog = Knit 2 together.

Gauge

Worked at a relaxed toy-knit tension in worsted weight yarn. Exact gauge isn't critical for a stuffed prop -- adjust stuffing firmness and needle size slightly to taste; a firmer fabric holds shape best.

Instructions

The Base Band

Cast on 41 sts loosely.

Rows 1-4: Work in Garter Stitch (Knit every row) to create a sturdy, non-rolling base band.

Row 5 (The Eyelet Row): K2, [YO, K2tog, K2]; repeat across the row to the last 3 sts, K3. This creates a line of decorative lace holes along the band.

Row 6: Knit all sts (including the YO loops).

Shaping the 5 Tiara Peaks

We will now work each triangle point individually using short rows.

Peak 1:

Row 1: K8, turn work, leaving the remaining sts unworked on the needle.

Row 2: Purl 8, turn.

Row 3: K1, SSK, K2, K2tog, K1, turn (6 sts).

Row 4: Purl 6, turn.

Row 5: K1, SSK, K2tog, K1, turn (4 sts).

Row 6: Purl 4, turn.

Row 7: SSK, K2tog (2 sts). Pass first st over the second st to bind off the point. Cut yarn and pull through the final loop.

Peaks 2, 3, 4, and 5:

Attach the yarn to the next unworked st on the main needle. Repeat the exact 7-row peak instructions over the next 8 sts. Repeat this process until all 5 peaks are completed across the 40 stitches (1 st will remain at the very end, simply bind it off).

Finishing

Weave in all the loose yarn tails tightly at the back of each peak. Bring the two short ends of the base band together and sew them using a neat mattress stitch to form a complete circular tiara crown. Steam block gently to open up the lace holes and make the 5 peaks stand up sharply.
