Sorcerer's Wand — Knitting Pattern

An upgraded version of a basic wand, this pattern combines a sleek I-cord shaft with a bulbous, geometric top segment representing an embedded magical gemstone.

This is an original pattern written for this item, based on standard, generic amigurumi and toy-knitting construction techniques (magic ring/CO, spiral increases and decreases, i-cord, stuffed tubes and spheres). It does not copy, trace, or reproduce any published or copyrighted pattern -- these underlying construction techniques are standard craft knowledge, not anyone's intellectual property, the same way a recipe's technique of 'creaming butter and sugar' isn't owned by any one baker.

Knit abbreviations: k = knit · p = purl · kfb = knit into front and back of st (inc 1) · k2tog = knit 2 together (dec 1) · CO = cast on · BO = bind off · dpns = double-pointed needles · pm = place marker · rnd(s) = round(s) · st(s) = stitch(es) · RS/WS = right side / wrong side

Materials

Yarn: Worsted weight yarn. Color A (Handle: Slate Gray or Brown, 15g) and Color B (Crystal: Bright Yellow, Pink, or Glow White, 10g).

Needles: US 4 (3.5 mm) DPNS.

Notions: Tapestry needle, 9-inch piece of heavy craft wire or 2 thick pipe cleaners (to make the shaft unbendable).

Gauge

Worked at a relaxed toy-knit tension in worsted weight yarn. Exact gauge isn't critical for a stuffed prop -- adjust stuffing firmness and needle size slightly to taste; a firmer fabric holds shape best.

Instructions

The Handle & Shaft (Color A)

Cast on 5 sts onto one DPN using Color A.

Work standard I-cord rows (Knit 5, slide sts back to the right tip without turning, pull yarn across back, knit again) until the rod measures 7 inches (18 cm) long.

Insert Support: Turn the sharp ends of your craft wire inward using pliers. Slide the wire directly into the hollow center of your I-cord shaft.

Do not bind off. Transfer the 5 sts evenly onto 3 DPNS to transition into the round for the crystal head.

The Magical Crystal Top (Color B)

Switch to Color B.

Rnd 1: [Kfb] in every st around (10 sts).

Rnd 2: [K1, Kfb] around (15 sts).

Rnds 3–6: Purl all sts around. (Working these rounds in purl stitch gives the crystal a rough, faceted gemstone texture that contrasts with the smooth handle.)

Rnd 7 (Decrease): [K1, K2tog] around (10 sts).

Stuffing: Stuff a tiny marble-sized pinch of fiberfill into the crystal head to make it plump.

Rnd 8 (Decrease): [K2tog] around (5 sts).

Cut yarn, thread through remaining 5 sts, pull tightly into a sharp point at the tip of the crystal, and knot securely. Weave all loose ends down inside the shaft.
